

CODE OF ETHIC FOR ADMINISTRATION OF
VERMONT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
MAIDSTONE TOWN

Introduction: Consistent with the provisions of Vermont law and Federal management standards, the Town of Maidstone has adopted the following code of ethical conduct for public officials, employees, and/or affected contractors. The policies and principles described below are intended to cover all aspects of the Vermont Community Development Programs, whether specifically cited or otherwise.

Provisions:

1. Goods and services shall be procured in a manner which maximizes free and open competition.
2. Officers and employees shall not participate in any decision concerning matters in which they have a financial interest.
3. Conflicts and the appearance of conflicts of interest shall be avoided in order to assure public confidence in the operations of governments.
4. Every effort will be made to actively recruit woman-owned or minority-owned businesses and to provide opportunities for local residents and businesses, consistent with Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968.
5. All procurement actions shall be conducted in public and all records related thereto will be open to the public review.

Adoption:

This Code of Ethics was adopted by the legislative body of the Town of Maidstone on June 20, 1988.
